Cecile Elstein MA, MAFA (1938–2025)

Sculptor, Printmaker, Environmental Artist

Biography Overview

Born in Cape Town, South Africa in 1938, Cecile Elstein (née Hoberman) emigrated to the UK in 1961 with her husband Max Elstein to escape the apartheid regime. She lived and worked in London and Southampton before settling in Manchester in 1977. A studio pupil of surrealist artist Catherine Yarrow and a long-term collaborator with master printmaker Kip Gresham, Elstein developed a prolific and multifaceted practice across sculpture, print, environmental installation, and portraiture. She died in 2025.
